We identified two streams of scaling agile frameworks. **Transformation-focused** frameworks center around process agility by offering a transformation roadmap with necessary steps (*Transformation process*) and/or assessing companies regarding their state of transforming towards organizational agility (*Transformation progress*). **Organization-focused** frameworks in turn focus on product agility and the “blueprint” agile organization. This stream also has two sub-streams. While *Enterprise-focused* approaches address a vertical scaling mind-set with organizational levels from strategy to execution, *Inter-Team focused* frameworks address horizontal scaling with coordinating large numbers of agile teams.

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
